

Dr. Daphne Marussi obtained her medical degree and residency in psychiatry at the University of Campinas, Brazil. She specialized in Eating Disorders with a fellowship at the University of Sao Paulo and at Mc Gill University.

She worked as a psychiatrist and a professor at the University Hospital of Sherbrooke for 16 years, becoming an Associate Professor in 2008. During this period, she made an outstanding clinical and teaching contribution.

Clinically she developed an inpatient eating disorders program. She was also part of the Mood Disorders Program providing inpatient, outpatient and urgent care.

Academically, she directed the pre-doctoral program in psychiatry for 5 years and taught many cohorts of internships medical students and residents.

She was a member of the Quality of Act hospital's committee for many years.

For 5 years, she was also a member of the Professional Development Committee of the Province of Quebec.

Dr Marussi was nominated as a Distinguished Fellow of the APA in 2014.

In September 2016, she founded the "Women's Mental Health Clinic" in Sherbrooke. While keeping her affiliation with the University, she is also an attending psychiatrist for the University of Sherbrooke's students.

She is also a well-known and appreciated speaker for psychiatrist and family doctors throughout Quebec.

In 2018 she became a member of the prestigious American College of Psychiatrist. She is also the secretary of the Canadian Social Psychiatry Association.

During the last 4 years she has been an activist teaching doctors and the general population about Intimate Partner Violence and its consequences.
