

Has held positions in academic psychiatry in Israel, first at the Jerusalem Mental Health Center 1974-1984 and then at Ben Gurion University of the Negev 1985 to the present. Dr. Belmaker chaired the International College of Neuropsychopharmacology meeting in Jerusalem in 1982. His research interests include affective disorder, female genital mutilation (FGM) and psychological effects of sex trafficking. He has received the Anna Monika Prize for Research in Depression (1983), the Ziskind-Somerfeld Prize for Senior Research in Psychiatry (1993) and the European College of Neuropsychopharmacology Lilly Research Award (1996). He was President of the CINP 2008-2010 and Vice-President of the International Society for Bipolar Disorders 2012-2014 and President of the Israel Psychiatric Association 2015-2018.
