

**Humaira Siddiqi, MD**, is an Interventional Psychiatrist with deep connections to Virginia, District of Columbia, and the Maryland mental health communities. She has provided care in Women's Mood and Anxiety disorders and spearheaded the Interventional psychiatry service (ECT, rTMS), developing protocols for other emerging therapeutics for Kaiser Permanente Mid Atlantic.

Within 3 short years of joining the Mid-Atlantic Permanente Medical Group (MAPMG), she was selected as the Chief of Psychiatry for the Northern Virginia service area. During this time, she transformed the department, positively impacting key NCQA behavioral health HEDIS measures and metrics, which were recognized nationally.

An advocate for Medical Education, in 2019 she was appointed as the Medical Director of Undergraduate Medical Education. By overseeing and developing a comprehensive clinical education experience across all medical and surgical specialties, she advanced relationships with over a dozen affiliated institutions in the Mid-Atlantic area that rely on Kaiser Permanente as their clinical teaching site, thereby increasing influence and involvement with medical student clerkships in the region. As the primary liaison, programs that MAPMG and Kaiser Permanente Mid-Atlantic States (KPMAS) participate in include: George Washington University's (GWU) Clinical Apprenticeship Program (CAP), Johns Hopkins Longitudinal Ambulatory Clerkship, Georgetown's Family Medicine Clerkship, and the Medical Education, Penn State College of Medicine's (PSCOM) Longitudinal Integrated Clerkship (LIC) program, Drexel's Family Medicine Clerkship, Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) Family Medicine Clerkship, Eastern Virginia Medical School (EVMS)'s Physician Assistant (PA) student program and medical student electives.

Dr. Siddiqi is driving professionalized clinical teaching among Permanente physicians, guiding the cultivation of the next generation of practitioners who will be sensitive to Mental health needs irrespective of what specialty they may practice. Dr. Siddiqi also serves as a key psychiatric consultant on the Regional Threat Management Committee, the Working Minds: Mental Health in the Workplace Committee, the Kaiser Permanente Inter-Regional Emerging Therapeutics Committee, and most recently, is operating with the Equity, Diversity and Inclusion team to foster tangible growth in the medical school clerkship curriculum, shaping awareness and sensitivity in our future physicians. Originally from Southern California, she has called Northern Virginia home since 2001.
